
The Local Offer is a valuable resource for families and professionals offering information on the services and provisions available in Southwark for children and young people with SEND aged 0-25.

INFORMAL EXCLUSIONS

If a child or young person is excluded, it means they are not allowed to attend school for a fixed amount of time.

The decision to exclude is made by the head teacher and they must carefully consider the law when deciding to exclude a child or young person.

Informal exclusions are illegal, for example sending a child home to 'cool off' or only allowing a child or young person in for a reduced amount of time.

Students with a learning difficulty, health problem or disability can apply for **Disabled Students' Allowances (DSAs)** to cover some of the extra costs they have because of a mental health problem, long term illness or any other disability.




The St Giles Trust are running free interview skills and techniques workshops aimed at young people aged 16-25 who are not in education, employment or training.
