Training title	Content description	Add on modules	Description/contents
<b>Understanding autism L1</b>	This training presents what autism is, exploring challenges, differences and strengths in the following key areas: flexibility of thought and information processing, social interaction, communication and sensory experiences. Content includes “how to help,” sections after each topic with tips and practical strategies that can be applied to direct support and concludes with a scenario activity based on topics discussed throughout the session.	<b>ADHD</b>	This module details the 3 different types of ADHD, presenting associated challenges, differences, strengths and links between ADHD and Autism.
<b>Understanding autism and supporting behaviours L1</b>	Accompanying the above “Understanding autism” content, this training looks at understanding the functions of behaviours in more depth, proactive prevention strategies and how to use different strategies at different stages of arousal with a focus on responding to needs and reducing anxiety. The training will also close with a scenario activity.	<b>Mentoring autistic people</b>	This module looks at both 1:1 and group mentoring styles, brainstorming extra considerations and tips to support autistic mentees.
<b>Understanding autism + add on modules/ bespoke topics</b>	Along with our standard “Understanding autism L1” topics, this training will allow for another hour of content either tailored to your service’s specific needs or, up to two of the specified “add on modules.”	<b>Presentations in women and girls</b>	This module explores gender bias within autism diagnosis, differences in presentations and misconceptions.
<b>Understanding autism and supporting families</b>	This training details what autism is, expanding on the 4 main areas of difference. “How to help” tips and strategies follow each section of the training are tailored to practitioners who support families and include strategies to cascade to parents and ideas things to consider conducting visits, and planning support.	<b>Autism and mental health</b>	This module presents common co-occurring mental health conditions, discussion around contributing factors, misdiagnosis and receiving appropriate support.
