What is PBS?

- Not a specific technique, but a broad approach to working with people who engage in behaviours that challenge
- The aim of a PBS approach is to **improve quality of life**. The reduction of behaviours that challenge is a side-effect of this.
- PBS aims to do this by:
 - Developing an understanding of why the behaviours of concern happen (finding the 'function').
 - Helping to establish new behaviours or skills in the person and those who support them.
 - Making changes to the environment.

Length of course: 2 days (generally delivered consecutively)

Target audience: Direct support staff, parent/ carers

Spaces available: 150 (10 sessions for 15 people over next 2 years)

Overview:

- Provides the foundational knowledge for anyone expected to work within a PBS informed way.
- Helps create lightbulb moments, challenges attributions and embeds theory and curiosity (functional thinking).
- Reiterates that PBS is a preventative framework focussed on improving quality of life through the development of capable environments.

BILD PBS Coaches Programme

Length of course: 3 days + 1 day delivered 6 months later (9am-7pm on day 1 and 2 and 9am-4pm on day 3).

Target audience: Practitioners with some practical experience of PBS who would like to extend their knowledge and support the implementation of a positive behaviour support approach within their service or organisation

Spaces available: Funds allocated based on application and availability

Overview:

- Considers the current context of PBS, the specific elements of a PBS approach and how to embed PBS within services and organisations
- Incorporating practice leadership approaches, the focus is on supporting colleagues to make changes to practice that impact positively on the people being supported.
- Coaches become the 'culture carriers' that support colleagues and maintain PBS tier one culture (capable environments).
- Includes pre-course reading and workplace assignments (relevant to services need) and a 1 day follow up training day six months later.

BILD PBS Level 4 Certificate

Length of course: 10 to 12 months (150 learning hours made up of online self-directed activities i.e. webinars, reading etc; practice-based activities i.e. assessments and case studies; and individual/ group online tutorials)

Target audience: Direct support roles such as support workers, teaching assistants and successfully completed by parent carers.

Course requirements: Level 2 English, Access to a 'Focus person'

Spaces available: Funds allocated based on application and availability

Overview:

Set across 3 units:

- Unit 1: Understanding Behaviours that Challenge and the role of Positive Behaviour Support (5 credits)
- Unit 2: Developing Capable Environments (6 credits)
- Unit 3: Supporting Functional Assessment and intervention (4 credits)
- All learners are supported by a tutor to navigate all learning required and will have access to lunchtime lectures and discounts at future Bild events.

BILD PBS Level 5 Diploma

Length of course: 12 to 18 months (350 learning hours)

Target audience: Direct support roles with responsibility for coaching others

Course requirements: Level 2 English, Access to a 'Focus person' **Spaces available:** Funds allocated based on application and availability

Overview:

Set across 5 units:

- Unit 1: Understanding behaviours that challenge and the role of positive behaviour support (5 credits)
- Unit 2: Developing capable environments (6 credits)
- Unit 3: Practice leadership, interactive coaching and active support (8 credits)
- Unit 4: Functional assessment and intervention (8 credits)
- Unit 5: Reducing restrictive practices (8 credits)
- Only BILD qualification that covers how to complete a Basic Functional Assessment and how to use this to co-produce, implement and quality check Positive Behaviour Support Plans.
- No demand to source in house supervision during training period as learners supported by Bild tutor
- Learners will also have access to all Bild's lunch time lectures and conference discounts etc.
- The qualification is certified by Pearsons and has been rated as gold via a skills for care peer review.

Completing an EOI

For PBS Coaches, Level 4 and Level 5

- 1. Read all of the course information to establish that it meets your learning needs and that you meet any criteria and can commit the time necessary
- 2. Complete the **EOI form**, which includes
 - o Information about you (the applicant) i.e. contact details, current contract
 - Information about your organisation i.e. contact info, type of org, numbers of people who currently have a PBS qualification and to what level, current approach to behaviour support
 - EOI i.e. which training you'd like to access, why, existing training/ qualifications in related areas, when you could commence study
 - o Management & organisational support i.e. managers detail, statement of support
- 3. Submit EOI form by 12noon on Friday 7th June 2024
- 4. EOIs will be reviewed by a cross-system working group and applicants notified over the summer
