What is PBS?

- Not a specific technique, but a broad approach to working with people who engage in behaviours that challenge
- This may include children or adults with a learning disability and/ or Autism
- The aim of a PBS approach is to **improve quality of life**. The reduction of behaviours that challenge is a sideeffect of this.

Who is the training for?

- Anyone who provides direct support to children and/ or adults with a learning disability and/ or Autism
- This training is open to staff from social care, education, health or community services, and parents/ carers.

What does this course cover?

- Essential knowledge needed by anyone who provides direct support and implements behaviour support strategies or a behaviour support plan
- The purpose and essential elements of a behaviour support plan, including proactive strategies such as teaching new skills, as well as reactive strategies.
