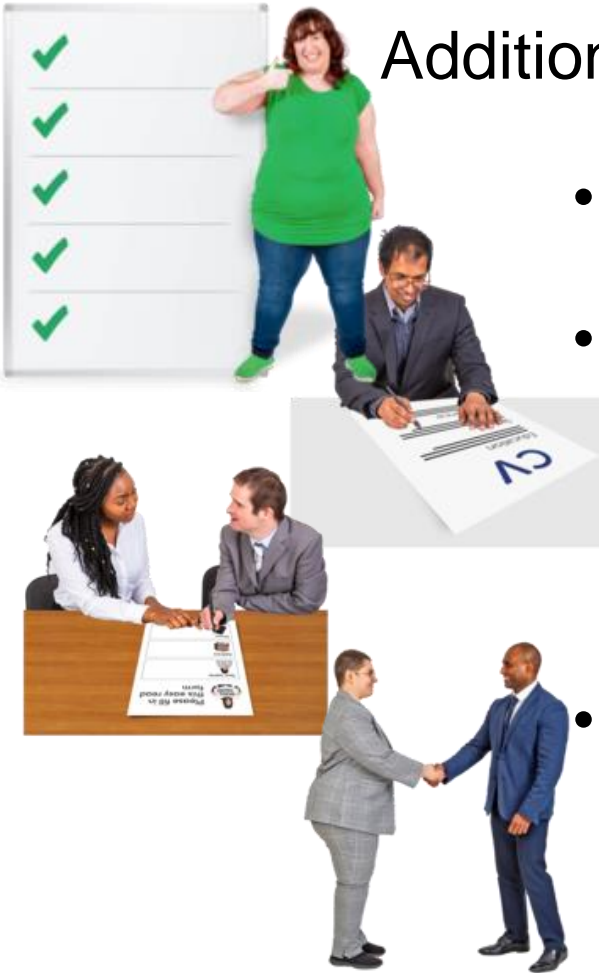
Health and wellbeing approach will focus on:

- Practical skills around travel, digital inclusion, budgeting.



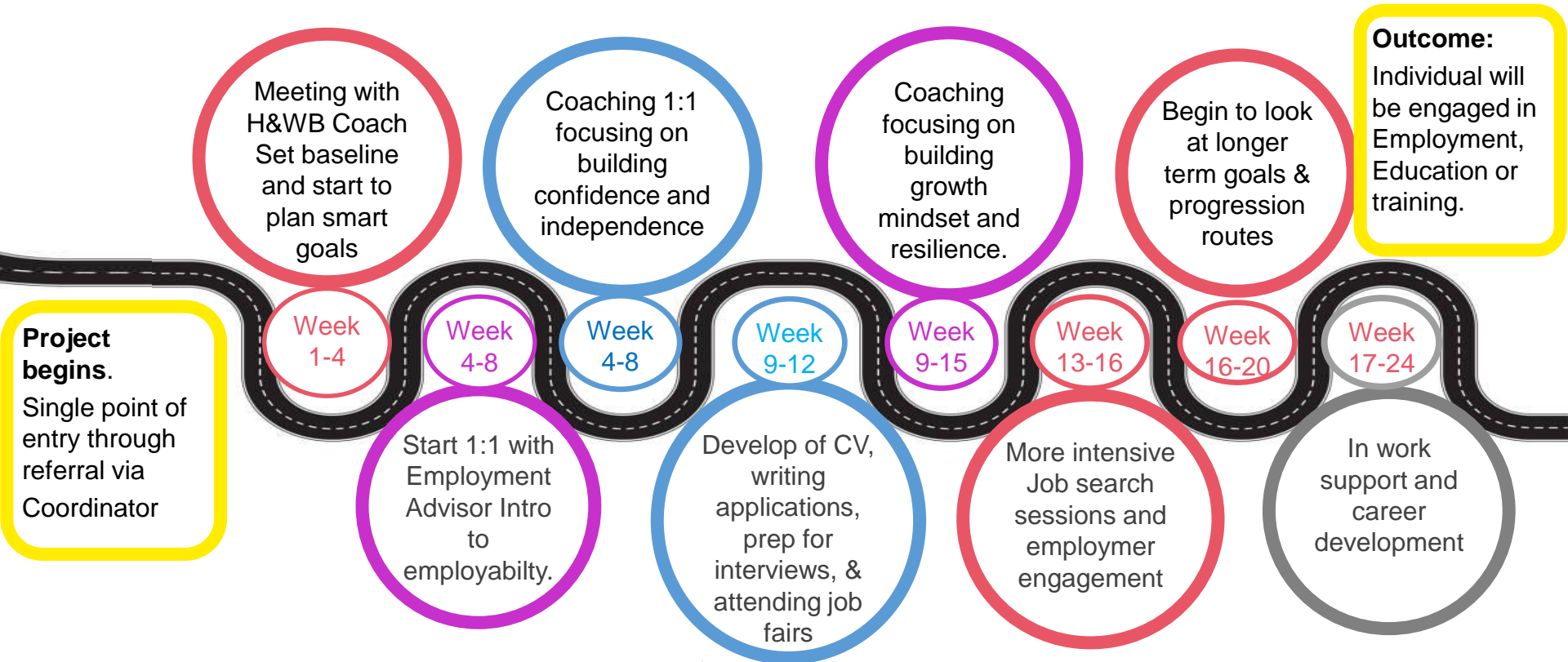
Additional support from Employment Team:
