## THE 'NEW NORMAL' WAY OF WORKING

Southwark Hearing Support Team, as many other services, have had to adapt ways of working during the Covid 19 pandemic. We are continuing to support our families and young people with hearing loss as well as all educational settings the best we can.

Some of our ways of working have had to change and we are continuously revising our practice. At the moment we are not carrying out face to face home visits but we are hoping to be able to arrange appointments with families in a designated Covid-safe location. We offer support to our families and young people via phone and/or video appointment. Some of our families and young people benefit and enjoy this opportunity of regular contact and we are happy to continue with our support whenever possible.

Support for schools stays the same with essential school visits being carried out and other appointments moved to a virtual platform. We need to comply with the government guidance of ensuring everyone's safety, therefore visits are kept shorter and focused more on equipment maintenance. Follow up virtual appointments are possible and welcomed by us. We use virtual platforms for staff training (Microsoft Teams and Zoom) and all necessary training is given to school staff as before. In a way we are more flexible in accommodating time for Inset we were not always able to accommodate before, which is very positive.

Some of our assessments cannot be carried out at the moment but Pupil Profiles are being updated and relevant information is passed on to teachers to ensure children's needs are met.

We are also continuing to work closely with the Children and Young People's Audiology Centre at St. Thomas' Hospital and our links with the audiology department and the Hearing Implant Team remain excellent.

We encourage you to contact us (details below) if you have any questions, are unsure of anything or if you simply need someone to talk to in these strangest of times. We are here for you as we always have been.

We understand that some miss face to face contact, maybe struggle a bit with new technology or simply find all of it a bit overwhelming. If that's how you feel, don't hesitate to pick up the phone and call us. We can discuss this with you and hopefully together find a way forward that works.

From now on we will be producing a regular newsletter with updates from the SHSS team, news, relevant information and links you may find useful.
