Established in 1991, Stone Group is a leading provider of ICT solutions to education and the public sector. Stone have supplied computers for Family Fund since 2008.


## How to use your grant

You can order your computer online, over the phone, or simply wait for Stone to call you. If you choose to wait, Stone will call you within seven days to discuss your needs. Once you have placed your order, they will then call you to arrange delivery.



## Ordering online with Stone

## Ordering your computer over the phone

To order over the phone call Stone on **0800 731 1784**, please have your award letter to hand.



## Important information

Your computer is supplied with a three-year warranty for technical faults and an accidental damage and theft insurance policy. Your documents will be in the box with your computer or pre-loaded onto the desktop. Please make sure that you read all of the documents carefully.

## Delivery of your computer

Your computer will be delivered within 14 days of you placing your order. Stone will contact you to arrange delivery. If the carrier is not able to deliver your computer, a card will be posted through your door. If this happens, you must contact the carrier to make arrangements for a different delivery date.

## Warranty

As with all warranties or insurance policies, it is important to note that deliberate damage or damage caused by general wear and tear will not be covered under the terms of the warranty or insurance policy. Family Fund will not be able to help with the costs of repairs that fall outside the terms of the warranty or the insurance policy.

## Technical support

If you need technical support once your computer has been delivered, please call **0800 731 1784**. We are option 1. Opening times are 9am to 8pm Monday to Friday and 10am to 5pm Saturday and Sunday. Stone provide a help line for software support for the life of your computer.

## Frequently Asked Questions

**What if I haven't been called by Stone?** If you haven't been called by Stone within seven days of the date on your award letter, please call them on **0800 731 1784**.

**What if I have moved address?** If you have moved address since your award, you will need to call Family Fund on **01904 550055** to update your address before Stone can arrange delivery.

**What if the computer I would like is not offered by Stone as a standard package?** Please call Stone on **0800 731 1784** to discuss your requirements. Any item that is not part of the standard packages may be more expensive than the award you have been given. You will need to pay Stone any additional cost when you place the order.

**What if the computer isn't working properly?** If you have any problems with the computer contact Stone on **0800 731 1784**.

**What happens if I don't use my grant within three months?** If you don't use your grant within three months then the award will be cancelled and the grant will be returned to Family Fund. However, Stone will make a number of attempts to contact you within the three months.
