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How to use this guide

Here are some pointers on how to use this guidebook effectively

Which School? for Special Needs is divided into specific sections:

1. Editorial

This includes articles, written by experts in their fields, explaining various aspects of special needs education. There are also case studies and other interesting articles.

2. Profiles

Here the schools and colleges have been given the opportunity to highlight what they feel are their best qualities in order to help you decide whether this is the right school for your child. They are presented in sections according to the needs they specialise in:

- social interaction difficulties (autism, ASC & ASP)
- emotional, behavioural and/or social difficulties.
- learning difficulties (including dyslexia/SPLD)
- sensory or physical impairment

Within these sections, schools and colleges are listed by region in alphabetical order.

3. Directory

Here you will find basic up-to-date information about every independent or non-maintained special needs school and college, and further education colleges, in England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales, giving contact details, size of school and which specific needs are catered for. (You will find a key to the abbreviations at the start of each directory section) The directory is divided into four sections:

- · social interaction difficulties (autism, ASC & ASP)
- emotional, behavioural and/or social difficulties.
- learning difficulties (including dyslexia/SPLD)
- · sensory or physical impairment

Within these sections, each establishment is listed by region in alphabetical order and those that have entries in the profiles section are cross-referenced to allow you to find further detailed information. Against each entry you will find a number of symbols indicating any SEN speciality, including an icon to indicate if the school is DfE approved.

4. Useful associations and websites

In this section we provide a list of useful organisations and websites relevant to special educational needs, which may be useful to parents looking for specific help or advice.

5. Maintained schools

Here we have included basic details of all maintained special schools in England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. They are listed according to their Local Authority.

6. Index

Page numbers preceded by a D indicate a school appearing in the directory, those without will be found in the profiles section.

How to use this guide effectively

John Catt's Which School? for Special Needs can be used effectively in several ways according to the information you are looking for. For example, are you looking for:

A specific school? If you know the name of the school but are unsure of its location simply go to the index at the back of the guide where you will find all schools listed alphabetically.

A particular type of school? Both the profiles and directories are divided into sections according to the type of provision. See also the appendix on page 141, which lists specific special needs and the schools that cater for them.

A school in a certain region? Look first in the relevant directory. This will give you the basic information about the schools in each region, complete with contact details and which specific needs are catered for. More detailed information can be found in the profiles section for those schools that have chosen to include a full entry.

More information on relevant educational organisations? At the end of the directories you will find a list of useful organisations and websites relevant to special educational needs.

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What a strange world we are living in at the moment

Douglas Silas, of Douglas Silas Solicitors, looks at the potential impact upon the SEN sector of the coronavirus crisis



As you read this, we may have already started to try to get back to some degree of normality, but as I write this, we are still living in a strange new world that has been taken over by the Coronavirus at the moment.

Many millions of people are now in 'lockdown' across the UK (and billons globally), aside from leaving their home to get essentials, to

get their one hour a day of exercise, or because they are considered to be 'key workers' whose job is considered a critical service to our nation.

So where do children and young people with SEN stand in all of this?

Well, we are just a few weeks now into school closures and people are already getting used to home working and/or educating and amusing their school/collegeage children at home. Although when school closures were announced, there was the theoretical request for some schools to remain open for children and young people who were considered 'vulnerable' (i.e. those with an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan) or a social worker), or children of 'key workers'; practically, many children and young people with EHC plans have been kept off school by their parents for varying reasons.

These include things like: not wanting their child being exposed to further risk of contracting the virus (or bringing it into their home); because they are concerned that the 'education' received at school will only really be 'care' (and not what they actually require in their EHC plan); or that their child will just become more confused and anxious if asked to attend a different school to that which they normally do or being with a new peer group that may be different or less understanding of them than their normal friends are.

In addition, there is a great difficulty for many children and young people, especially those with SEN, in distinguishing between doing schoolwork at school and being more relaxed at home.

Also, although special schools have been asked to remain open, many have actually been closed, due to staff shortages, or because they may be in the independent/non-maintained sector that is experiencing the same or other particular difficulties, including financially.

It is very important to bear in mind that there is no legal duty on parents to try to maintain the provision in their child's EHC plan whilst they are out of school and trying to do so will be an impossible task, so parents should not feel they need to try to.

It seems to me that the best that can be achieved in these difficult times is to come up with some kind of alternative or different schedule for home-schooling that everyone can 'buy into'.

Yet, as a result of all of this, we have also seen a rapid expansion in online learning and people adapting very quickly to do things in alternative ways, many of which have been very creative; although these do not really come anywhere near the personal help and one-to-one contact, which many children and young people with SEN require on a daily basis.

There is also the general view now, even in these comparatively early days, that schools are now going to remain closed for the summer term and may not open again until September. Therefore, for those children and young people transferring between phases of their education; whether that be from primary to secondary school, secondary school to post-16 education, or those

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leaving post-16/19 education generally to face the world, they may have effectively been stripped of their chance to say goodbye properly to their friends.

I have seen the following guidance produced for the current times, but which I think actually has a wider benefit for us all when looking to the future now when schools do reopen, which parents should probably still try to keep in mind when looking for a school for their child with SEN:

- Keeping minds active and happy is the most important factor.
- Work and tasks should suit the age range and capabilities of the children and expected outcomes should be flexible.
- Variety is key and bite-sized chunks of work are more likely to be completed and could be part of a bigger project.
- Set tasks that all pupils can complete to some degree of success, with extra and more complex or additional tasks for the most able pupils.

- Tasks that cover different areas of the curriculum allows pupils to choose those that interest them and makes it more likely that they will complete them.
- Post-16 learners might be able to carry out more open-ended, independent work, but structure and guidance is still needed for them.
- Many children need a lot of guidance when working and cannot be left for long periods of time to complete complex tasks.
- Parents might struggle to assist with schoolwork for a number of reasons - parents cannot be expected to become teachers.
- We cannot expect pupils or parents to replicate the classroom at home.
- Helping with gardening, cooking and washing can all be "educational".

As I say, it's a strange world we are living in at the moment, but maybe we can take away something positive for the future from this awful situation...

Making the best school move

Finding the right school environment for a child experiencing a learning challenge, for whatever reason, can be a complex and time-consuming process, but expert help is available, writes Lorna Woolley



Looking for specialist provision

Parents may be exploring specialist provision for a child or young person for many different reasons. Clear physical limitations or a medical condition may need to be accommodated, or a child's social and emotional needs arising from autism or ADHD may be unmet in their current school.

Some parents may be concerned about a child without an exact diagnosis who nevertheless seems unable to reach their potential in the present classroom setting, perhaps because they have a 'non-standard' learning style.

Whether a child's complex needs are not being addressed or they simply need to find a learning environment which values their 'difference', the right specialist staff and resources are key to helping them reach their full potential – educationally, socially and emotionally.

Listening to independent advice

Just as an independent financial adviser (IFA) is able to search the whole market and recommend the most appropriate products without being restricted to a particular provider, an independent educational adviser is not affiliated with a particular local authority, solicitor's practice, school or group of schools.

As well as recommending suitable schools and assisting families in their decision-making, an independent adviser can also facilitate necessary assessments or tests and ensure that any SEN solicitor or other professionals involved contribute their input in a timely manner.

Collating vital evidence

There are many excellent examples of independent, non-maintained and maintained schools and colleges in the UK, but searching for the 'best fit' for a child or young person with a range of needs is a time-consuming and sometimes daunting task. Of central importance in this search is the Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan, setting out the special educational needs of a child or young person, and the evidence contained within it.

As a legally binding document the EHC plan details the provision a local authority must put in place for your child and it is key to gaining the necessary funding. Expert, professional assessments and reports – detailing what an individual will require in order to reach their potential – give schools and colleges the all-important information enabling them to decide whether or not they are the right match.

Insufficient or inaccurate evidence in an EHC plan can lead to confusion about actual needs, lack of funding from the Local Authority, not enough support for the child or young person and, ultimately, placement breakdown. In addition, in order to achieve a successful result, the plan has to be written in terms of the specific and quantifiable provision which the child 'must receive', rather than simply what they 'would benefit from'. For example, this might be a specified number of hours per week of one-to-one support from a speech and language specialist.

Timing a move

For some children, remaining at a local mainstream school, with the right support in place based on the evidence within an EHC plan, can be a good solution. But nothing will ever compare to fully embracing a specialist setting which offers bespoke provision delivered by a multidisciplinary team of dedicated professionals.

Selecting from the wide choice of schools, each focusing on particular specialties, enables your child to learn in a setting among children having similar profiles, with staff and on-site therapies tailored to meet their specific requirements.

Teaching and learning styles, as well as staff training, can be adapted to match the cohort. The professionals within these special schools and colleges have found their vocation in teaching children and young people who learn just like your son or daughter.

Finding suitable placements after age 18/19 can often be problematic, but guidance in exploring alternatives at this stage is also available from independent advisers. The aim is to match a placement to the young person's own interests, enabling them to access appropriate vocational skills, qualifications and career guidance, while ensuring that any necessary therapies are continued.

Whenever a child or young person moves to a special school, the outcome for them should be special: as needs are met, difference is celebrated, and confidence and motivation increase, they can truly flourish.

Benefiting your family

I know from my own and my sons' experience that achieving the best school move at the right time not only transforms a child's future but brings significant benefits for the whole family.

For children and young people able to board at a special school, the opportunity of an extended waking day curriculum is also life-changing for parents, carers and siblings. Wraparound support helps professionals to guide the children and young people in their care; teaching independent living skills and the ability to manage crucial routines will maximise each child's or young person's life chances. This is the work of trained professionals and leaves parents and siblings to be just that – family.



Never excluding transforms the lives of pupils

Thomas Keaney, CEO and Schools' Proprietor of TCES Group, on the goal of delivering exceptional outcomes for exceptional pupils

Earlier in the school year independent research by Goldsmiths University of London found that TCES Group schools and services – which share a policy of never permanently excluding – have transformed the life chances of our exceptional pupils, who have complex and co-morbid SEMH needs and/or an ASC.

Researchers interviewed past pupils – 90 per cent of whom are in education, employment or training up to five years after leaving us – to get to the heart of the pupil experience.

The researchers found that: 'an emphasis on attachment, along with a diversified and differentiated curriculum, with group process at its core, allowed these young people to feel understood, to feel welcomed and to learn the social and academic skills to engage with all aspects of life more positively.'

They went on to say that TCES Group, through our inclusive philosophy of never giving up, provides 'authentic, therapeutic education at its finest', which 'is effective in transforming the lives of its pupils educationally, emotionally and socially' within our inclusive schools.

The findings were an excellent boost for our schools, services and staff, and for the families who have put their trust in us. As importantly, they pinpoint the key ingredients that have gone into the creation of our inclusive educational settings. In the foreword, our Patron Dame Esther Rantzen states, "I believe that this policy of never permanently excluding, along with other interventions could and should be used as a template for the educational sector as a whole."

The most significant ingredient, the one that cascades through everything we do, is our determination to



deliver exceptional outcomes for our exceptional pupils, whether learning in school or remotely. By embedding a 'never give up' philosophy we challenge ourselves to manage, contain and respond to difficult and disruptive behaviour, rather than retaliating and/or resorting to permanent or fixed term exclusions. We know that this inclusive approach has a deep and lasting influence, contributing to our pupils' stability and security. Our pupils' cycle of previous exclusions is broken by our staff's refusal to be pushed away or to give up.

Children and young people whose previous experience of school has been one of feeling rejected or let down by adults, need to be met where they are. Every one of the pupils Goldsmiths researchers spoke to described in their own words how healthy attachments and relationships with our staff were key to unlocking their potential. Those relationships provided them with a secure base to move on from and, along with our Group Process, provided regular opportunities for pupils to practise their empathy within a safe, reciprocal relationship.

High expectations means different things for different pupils and meeting children where they are means that success for those with significant and debilitating anxiety is simply having the courage to walk into the classroom. From that point onwards we can explore their interests, their talents and create a set of leadership opportunities

that allows them to build a strength-based perception of themselves.

Ofsted data released in March this year found a drop in schools rated Outstanding since the introduction of their new Framework in 2019, which puts more focus on assessing whether a school has a well-designed and ambitious curriculum with the same high ambition for all pupils.

Person-centred curricula, rooted in high expectations, is another of the key planks of our approach.

We were therefore delighted, but not overly surprised, to retain our Outstanding grading at our North West London Independent School (NWLIS). One of the ways we engage pupils at that setting is through a rich, individualised Art curriculum. Previously disruptive, violent pupils have had their overall outlook positively transformed by being supported to develop their interests and achieve subject success at both GCSE and A Level. Notably, a recent student achieved a Grade C in their Art GCSE, despite being in a place of security for most of their final year and being supported remotely by their teacher. The student was anxious to take the GCSE and do well because he didn't want to 'let his teacher down.'

Goldsmiths researchers were struck by the way that all the TCES Group alumni they interviewed had a clear sense of identity, pride and purpose, and were able to We know that this inclusive approach has a deep and lasting influence, contributing to our pupils' stability and security. talk about who they were, and what they wanted to do in the future (their 'Journey of Change'). Within each school our L.I.F.E (Leadership Skills, Independence Skills, Future Outcomes and Empowerment or Employability or Enterprise skills) Programme provides opportunities for pupils to prepare for a successful, independent life outside of school by developing their skills and understanding in a deliberate and forensic way. At NWLIS for example, art-related work experience within industry and inviting accomplished artists into school (including those with ASC like many of our pupils) is one of the ways we encourage pupils to conceptualise ideas about first having a future (daring to dream) and secondly a future career.



For us that is our dream too. A virtuous cycle starting with leadership roles and mentoring curriculum in our primary classes, leading to levels two to four mentoring qualifications and more senior responsibilities in our secondary classes. It then ends with Traineeships and Apprenticeships in teaching and care for our graduates who return as volunteer mentors or apprentice mentors. Then finally, we have home grown talented neurodiverse employees who start the virtuous cycle again. We are working hard to introduce the same virtual cycle for the parents of our pupils.

In 2020/21 our practice will continue to develop, but our underlying approach will remain constant. SEND pupils thrive through a combination of being listened to and understood by well-trained professionals and being encouraged to have an active voice and role in their school community; through receiving support to develop their sense of identity around their strengths and their future. Under-pinning all of this has to be the knowledge that their teachers and their school will never, ever give up on them and quite simply never resort to exclusion, either permanent or fixed term.

How parents and carers can manage educational transitions effectively

Parents and carers are on the frontline when it comes to managing challenging educational transitions for students with special educational needs.

Dr Vaughn Price is regularly asked to share his expertise on how parents and carers can ensure students are well equipped to handle educational progression.

Whether they are changing schools, heading to college, or moving on into the community, the Principal Clinical Psychologist at Beechwood College sets out his recommendations to support students in adjusting to this time of change.

Why educational transitions are challenging

As we are all aware, people with special educational needs can find transition between life events, or simply changes to everyday routine, especially difficult.

Educational transitions are often among the most daunting and hardest to absorb.

One of the fundamental pieces of advice I give to any parent or carer during this phase is to maintain their daily routine as closely as possible.

As we know SEN individuals value routine highly, as such monitoring and controlling this will ensure consistency, and avoid any potentially stressful, unplanned situations.

Easing the transition

During any transition three things need to be prioritised above all else – Consistent communication between all parties involved; really listening to what the young person says; and thoroughly communicating the transition process to the young person.

We all understand the value of communication in supporting people through stressful, or emotional times. When it comes to supporting someone with SEN through a potentially distressing transition, this is even more vital.

Effective communication between the student and everyone involved with the transition definitely helps to ease the process and introduce a sense of order.

Most importantly the students must see themselves as being a central part of the process and must feel fully involved and know that their voice will be heard and their wishes valued and considered.

Visual communication

During my years of work with people with SEN I have found that visual communication is actually highly effective in communicating transitions and is often the forgotten tool.

Visual information is much more easily processed in comparison to verbal information, and studies have found that 65% of verbal information is retained after three days when supported by visual aids, compared with just 10% without.

I always recommend to parents that photos, videos, and infographics can be highly effective when explaining and mapping the transition.

Know your surroundings

As with any one of us, familiarity encourages us to feel less anxious about a new situation.

The same is true for someone with special educational needs. As such I would also suggest to parents and carers to take students for as many scheduled visits as can be rearranged. Dates of visits should always be fully communicated, so they are not unexpected and the student can prepare fully.

These visits will give students the opportunity to acclimatise to their new environment, meet new people, and visualise their transition more effectively in the long run.

Additionally, they enable parents and carers to familiarise themselves with the student's new surroundings and care team and provide the appropriate support for effective transition.

Getting organised

A final suggestion I would make is to support the young person in making a transition pack to introduce a sense of organisation into the process. This pack can include maps of the new service, pictures of staff, examples of work expected, lists of new rules, and a frequently asked questions (FAQ) section.

Introducing visuals and colour-coded themes into it will simplify the process for the person and help them retain the new information more easily.

By scheduling and organising the new routine in this way, parents and carers can aid the student to achieve a sense of control and consistency, which will help to ease any anxiety.

Hugh

Hugh was previously placed within a residential setting specialising in supporting individuals with epilepsy, despite his having autism and severe LD. However, Hugh engaged in a variety of behaviours that challenged the staff team, in particular physical aggression and environmental damage which meant he was not attending formal education and they had to serve notice on his placement and he was accepted at Beechwood College.

As part of the initial transition planning, the College worked closely with his existing support team to develop a well planned and executed transition appropriate to his needs. This included periods of staff shadowing to build a working rapport; involving Hugh in the planning process and making him part of the decision-making team; concrete visual information with photographs and social stories explaining what was happening; and overnight stays prior to him moving into the College. This allowed Hugh to understand and agree with what was happening as much as possible and prepared him for the change, helping to reduce the anxiety that he would inevitably experience.

When Hugh finally moved to Beechwood he settled into College life well. Understandably he still demonstrated signs of anxiety and behaviours that challenged. However, subsequent sensory and communication assessments have allowed the College to develop personalised strategies that allow him to control his behaviours more effectively. These strategies have also been incorporated into Hugh's educational day and embedded into a curriculum designed to build Hugh's skills for future life.

Hugh is in his second year at the College and is generally happier and more relaxed and his incidents of challenging behaviour have been consistently decreasing.

Getting back to school

How the Fullerton House, of the Hesley Group, helped 'Lisa' make progress and thrive in her education

Starting at Fullerton House

Before arriving at Fullerton House School, Lisa lived in seclusion in a local respite service and hadn't attended school for 18 months. She had tried attending a number of special schools, but attendance had always been difficult for Lisa and every provision ad struggled to meet her complex needs.

Lisa arrived at Fullerton House in 2016. Her former accommodation had been extremely sparse due to high levels of property damage. On arriving at her new home at Fullerton House, Lisa significantly challenged her environment, pulling radiators off walls, ripping up carpets and destroying every light fitting. Initial attempts to introduce Lisa to school were very difficult; refusing to dress, ripping her clothes and stripping were a daily occurrence. With no formal method of communication, Lisa struggled to let those supporting her know her needs and wants; frustrated, Lisa displayed extreme levels of physical aggression were displayed towards staff.

An MDT Approach

Clearly, as a young person with autism, learning disabilities and complex needs, Lisa found engaging with the world around her very challenging. Living on her own, not accessing school or her local community, Lisa's world risked becoming smaller and smaller. The Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) at Fullerton House needed to develop strategies to reverse this trend as soon as possible.

The Speech and Language Therapist (SaLT) team trialled a number of approaches to support Lisa's communication e.g. PECS, GoTalk, Attention Autism, Makaton, Grid Player. Some approaches were more successful than others with daily Makaton signing sessions proving particularly successful, helping Lisa to start to develop critical communication skills. Occupational Therapy led sensory integration assessments and sessions were carried out. A box of sensory items was developed, helping Lisa to more effectively self-regulate and engage in her environments.

She has made so much progress during her time at Fullerton House that family meals with her parents to busy Italian restaurants, regular family outings including a family wedding and birthday parties, have all been possible. Obviously, the joy this has brought to Lisa, her family and all those who support her at Fullerton House is immense.

The Psychology Team had begun work with Lisa's previous respite service whilst she was still there as part of a thorough transition process; Fullerton staff shadowed her staff team at the respite service to gather key information. A functional behaviour assessment was carried out resulting in a number of recommendations and agreed strategies; the MDT worked together to ensure these were implemented across both the care and education settings. A core support team was developed that worked altered hours to ensure consistency and reduce transitions. A bespoke education package, based on Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA), was implemented to re-integrate Lisa into the school programme. The psychology team provided extensive input and support to address her reluctance to attend school, working closely with the education team.

So how is Lisa doing now?

Lisa attends school every day and engages in her lessons. She wears her school uniform and allows her staff to plait her hair neatly; she now dresses appropriately almost all of the time. She attends community-based activities, particularly enjoying, swimming and cycling. Lisa now communicates using Makaton signing, gesture and pointing. Her staff team sign key words throughout the day with Lisa frequently signing two/three-word sentences to her staff. She will choose her lunch from symbols available at the school canteen. Previously, Lisa made very limited food choices; she is now eating a varied and healthy diet, choosing all the meals available in school and enjoying a variety of different foods at home.

With her communication needs now far better met, Lisa rarely displays aggression towards her staff. Her home environment is still relatively minimal in terms of usual furnishings, but with the huge progress made over time and property damage now minimal, more homely furniture is being trialled.

Having been unable to live within her family home for a number of years, developing good quality contact time has been really important for Lisa. She has made so much progress during her time at Fullerton House that family meals with her parents to busy Italian restaurants, regular family outings including a family wedding and birthday parties, have all been possible. Obviously, the joy this has brought to Lisa, her family and all those who support her at Fullerton House is immense.

What next?

As Lisa approaches young adulthood, the future looks much brighter for her than it did before she arrived at Fullerton House. Back to school, engaging in her learning and accessing her local community mean so many more doors are now open for her. Back in 2016, Lisa was out of school, isolated in her own home and facing the prospect of her already small world getting even smaller. Now, a range of young adult service options can be explored with confidence, knowing that the progress made so far can be built upon to give Lisa every opportunity to further explore her potential and the wider world around her.

What you can do to help your dyslexic child at home

As a parent, you want to help your child in any way you can. We spoke with the specialist Learning Support Team at Bredon School, a dyslexia friendly boarding and day school in Gloucestershire, and found out their top tips for what a parent can do at home to support their dyslexic child's education.

1. Self-esteem is key

It is important to talk to your child and help them to understand what dyslexia is. Emphasize that it does not mean that they are less intelligent. There are strong links between dyslexic children and low self-esteem. Focus on what your child is good at – praise them for effort and don't always point out mistakes. Spot the talents in your child and encourage them in all manner of pursuits; there can be a huge pressure on young people to be academically successful. Make sure they know that there are lots of different types of success; if English Literature isn't their thing, maybe they need to be reminded that they are a brilliant piano player, rugby player, puzzle solver... after all, a happy child is far more likely to achieve their full potential.

2. Focus on your child's interests

Getting your child excited about reading or writing can be far easier and more effective if the subject is something that they are interested in. Find out what your child has a passion for and use this to help with activities at home. Taking a strong interest in your child's talents will also help you to support and encourage them to pursue their goals and develop a stronger sense of self-belief.

3. Make homework fun

Let's face it – most children don't run through the front door after school, eager to sit down quietly to do their homework. This said, there are some sneaky ways in which you can bring reading and writing into everyday tasks to help your child practice. Next time you need to go shopping, ask them to help write out the shopping list; when you play a board game as a family, ask them to read the instructions out; as you are cooking dinner, get them to help by reading out instructions from the recipe...

4. Seek a school which can offer the right support

Finding the right school for your child is not easy but it is definitely up there in terms of important decisions. Firstly, look into the support that your child needs; they may need smaller class sizes or extra support outside of lessons. Some schools will also offer dyslexia friendly teaching – for example at Bredon pupils are never asked to copy down from the board and all pupils have a Google Chromebook which has helpful software already installed for them such as text-to-speech and dictation software. Visit the schools you are interested in and ask them about their support offered for dyslexic children. If they don't have a dedicated SEN (Special Educational Needs) team, or see this as a priority, move on to the next!

5. The sooner you intervene, the better

The sooner you are able to place your child in the right educational environment, the better. If a dyslexic child starts their education in a school which is unable to offer them the extra support they may need, or simply teach in a way that makes it easier for them to understand, they may develop a negative relationship with being at school. They also may not understand why they find certain tasks more difficult than others in their class, which could contribute to a lack of confidence in their own abilities.

6. Get to know your child's teachers

It is really important to develop and maintain an open dialogue with your child's school. Their teachers will see a completely different side to your child whilst they are at school and it is important that you are able to work as a team; speak with the teaching staff openly about any concerns you may have. Your child's teachers will be able to give insight into your child's progress from a different perspective. They will know what is expected of your child for their age and how they are performing compared with other pupils in their year group. It could be that you are unnecessarily worried about something – teachers should always be welcoming to any questions you have and are there to help you.

7. Make use of good tech

It's 2020 and technology, such as voice recognition, is on the rise – lots of us use Siri, Google Voice Search or even have an Alexa in our homes (and even on our phones). Encourage your child to ask Alexa history facts, or ask questions to help with research for a homework project; this will cut out some of the time it takes to sit and stare at a computer screen, reading on a stark white background

(notoriously unhelpful for dyslexics) from font that may be difficult for a dyslexic mind to de-code.

There are free text-to-speech apps out there and these can be enormously helpful for anyone who finds reading from a computer screen, tricky. The same can be said for speech-to-text (dictation software), which helps with getting ideas down in writing.

For inquisitive minds, audiobooks are a fantastic way to enjoy reading, without having to actually read from the page; this way, dyslexics can consume knowledge without barriers.

8. Visuals, visuals, visuals!

Chances are you already know that your child is a visual learner. Widgit – www.widgitonline.com - is a great tool that you can use to create symbol documents. You can use Widget to create visual timetables. If your child's school doesn't do this, you can create one at home for them. You could also create a bedtime routine with symbols and/or photos alongside it, or plan a family day out with a visual itinerary of the day. This will all help to associate words with images and aid your child's reading skills.

9. Dyslexia and intelligence are two totally separate things

The most important thing you can do for your child is simply be there for them. Be there to encourage, support and inspire them. Reassure them about their talents and make sure they have a good understanding of dyslexia, what it is and how it affects their learning. Being dyslexic does not mean they have lower intelligence and there are a lot of positive traits that dyslexics have, such as being able to see the bigger picture, being more imaginative and being great problem solvers. Do your research and make sure that your child knows just how amazing they are!

10. Don't let them use it as an excuse

This point sounds harsh – but it is true. There is no reason at all why someone with dyslexia can't become extremely successful and achieve their goals and ambitions. Just take a look at some of the many famous dyslexics – Kiera Knightly, Holly Willoughby or Leonardo Da Vinci! We all have those days where everything seems to be more difficult than normal and we would rather just go back to bed – don't let your child use dyslexia as a reason they 'can't' do something and therefore give up. Yes, there are going to be difficult days, but if you have the determination to push on and work hard, you can and will achieve.

Embedding a Therapies Programme

Simon Jaggard, Head teacher and Director of Education, and Karen May, Director of Therapies, explain the integrated approach at St. Joseph's

St. Joseph's Specialist Trust is a co-educational children's home and day school catering for pupils between the ages of 5-19 with complex and severe learning difficulties. It is a truly collegial environment where each member of staff is an essential cog in the education/therapeutic/ care machine that is St. Joseph's. We support and care for children who encounter enormous day to day challenges when faced with what we might deem to be the simplest of day to day tasks. These young people are supported, encouraged, nurtured, empowered, and cultivated to achieve all that they can for the short window of their lives which is spent in school. This is the one time in which society invests in them and they must have every opportunity to make progress in all areas of their development to give them opportunities to access the wider community in later life.

The therapy team, working alongside the education team, enables prerequisites for academic learning to be highlighted and prioritised. Speech and language therapists can focus on developing non-verbal skills, turn-taking, joint attention, symbolic play and social interaction in order to support receptive and expressive communication. Occupational therapists can support and advise on sensory integration, bilateral awareness, motor planning and visual-spatial skills which are important building blocks in the learning triangle, leading to increased cognitive development. Creating an environment whereby expertise is shared across all disciplines enables the small steps approach to be adjusted up or down in a timely proactive manner. This ensures students benefit from a truly holistic approach to learning and all aspects of development and growth can be recorded and celebrated, be it literacy and numeracy focused or self-help or social skills.

Students with learning difficulties of this level require a 'small steps' approach in order to facilitate learning. Across the curriculum, students may need to continue to access multi-sensory approaches. Multi-sensory approaches support our students to challenge and overcome their barriers to learning. The curriculum builds on individual strengths, interests and experiences which will be reflected in the schemes of work and individual education plans. Through this process, the school will develop, implement and review a developmental curriculum which addresses the specific impairments of the students' disabilities and provide access to the National Curriculum as appropriate to the developmental level of each student.

"Leaders' plans to pull together all strands of pupils' learning and development to provide a clear and comprehensive overview of the targets and achievement of each pupil are very well judged."

For students with ASD this curriculum will be in part remedial, in helping students to overcome deficits and in part compensatory. Curriculum delivery will reflect the need for structure and repetition within subject areas which, in turn, will provide access to learning. The spiral curriculum revisits previous learning and knowledge and cements and builds upon what has been learned and experienced. Grabbing the attention of young people can be challenging at the best of times, at the worst of times the attention may be delivered on a vehicle of antisocial behaviour. These are not new ideas and indeed neither is the concept of an embedded and integrated therapies programme.

"Close working between education staff and therapists ensures that learning activities are sharply focused on meeting pupils' learning and development needs. This supports outstanding progress over time."

What is different about St. Joseph's approach is that each class is led by a triad of class teacher, occupational therapist and speech and language therapist; there is no lead but a collaboration of professionals which really reflects the wider culture of an organisation that values problem solving and innovation. St. Joseph's is fortunate to have a full team of Speech and Language therapists, Occupational therapists and designated therapy assistants who are working within the classrooms to remove the obstacles to learning which traditional educational approaches have failed to achieve. Some students at St. Joseph's have been unable to remain in other settings



and here they are able to access a truly individualised approach. By reducing the barriers which often hinder learning in other educations settings, pupils can develop a love for being at school and the individualised programmes supports each young person's strengths which become the focus of development. Mental health and well-being is supported through daily therapy led group sessions focusing on feelings and encouraging reflection and increasing awareness of strategies for emotional regulation.

The class teams follow a weekly cycle of meetings which supports embedded planning, consistent behaviour support and sharing of expertise across the school and college. These are structured by the three education pathways which range from Explorers (P4-8), to Discoverers (P8-NC2) and Adventurers (NC3 upwards). These pathways are jointly managed by a team of middle managers from education and therapy; a teacher and therapist jointly oversee each pathway strand. The pyramid of learning is an essential starting point; sensory systems and motor development are the key to accessing cognition and intellect.

"The school provides a rich range of opportunities for all pupils who are able to, to study vocational subjects, and prepare very well for the world of work. The offer is highly bespoke to each pupil's interests and aspirations." Outstanding Ofsted Nov 2017

The activities of the wider curriculum are the vehicles for therapeutic input and the development of functional numeracy and literacy. The embedded model is also supported by additional psychological interventions; a team of Arts Psychotherapists (Art, Drama, Music) provide sessions to overcome significant barriers and trauma. In addition Clinical Psychologist and psychiatrist provide an in-house CAHMS for both residential and day students as required.



Preparing for Adulthood at Queen Alexandra College (QAC)

Queen Alexandra College (QAC) is a national specialist residential college that supports a diverse range of student abilities and needs. Based in Birmingham, the College offers an innovative, holistic approach to learning and support. It provides education, training and routes to independent living and employment. Class sizes are small and support levels high.

QAC is a stepping stone to your future life. Whatever your ambitions, QAC staff will provide support and assistance when leaving College based around your needs and aspirations to progress on to meaningful provision such as further education, higher education, supported internships, employment and supported living.

Regular Annual Reviews will be held with you, your family, College staff and other relevant professionals. Following the review a person-centred plan will be created and your Education, Health and Care (EHC)

plan will be updated to reflect your needs.

Kerry Lowe, QAC Transitions Officer, commented: "During your time at QAC you will receive support, information, advice and guidance based around your needs and aspirations to explore your future options. My role is to help you make positive plans for what will happen when you leave QAC."

Emily's story: from Queen Alexandra College to paid employment...

Former QAC residential student Emily entered paid employment at The Birmingham Repertory Theatre in Birmingham City Centre.

Emily really enjoyed her time at QAC and successfully completed a vocational Hospitality programme. The College provided the support that she needed and offered her the opportunity to complete an external work placement with The Birmingham Repertory Theatre as part of her course.

Initially the work placement was over a three-month period, but it went so well Emily's placement converted to paid employment upon completion of her studies at QAC. Emily now works two regular shifts a week as a Barista and Usher, but often gets offered overtime due to her hardworking and professional attitude.

Responsibilities include opening the bar, serving drinks, greeting customers, selling programmes and merchandise, cleaning and taking payments. Emily loves music and theatre, so this is the perfect role for her!

Rather than return to the family home, Emily also progressed onto the College's supported living option, Independence Plus (IP). As a residential student, QAC's 24-hour curriculum helped Emily develop her independent living and social skills and Independence Plus allowed her to continue to develop this independence.

Clients on the IP programme still need support and the aim is to deliver a service that provides the means to live independently/semi independently into the distant future.

During 2018/19, 95% of QAC students achieved their main learning aim on accredited qualifications with progression outcomes for students (107 leavers including Emily) as follows:

- 18% Employment (voluntary and paid)
- 4% General FE
- 1% HE Institution
- 5% Independent Specialist College
- 48% Other (including Adult Social Care)
- 24% QAC Supported Internship/other programme
- 1% Work Based Training





Taking the whole curriculum outdoors

Dr Gill Barrett, Principal of The Loddon School®, explores learning beyond the classroom

When we think of learning at school we are conditioned to think indoors and inside a classroom. However, any approach to learning works just as effectively outdoors as it does indoors. For a child with SEND the outdoor environment can be the ideal place for learning. The Loddon School emphases outdoor learning especially through free and structured play for all its students and was delighted to be awarded the status of Forest Schools Provider and named as an Outdoor Trailblazer school for Hampshire.

Outdoor learning is an umbrella term which embraces every type of learning experience which happens

outside. Outdoor learning is about making the most of any place or space outside of the traditional school walls. Forest Schools have become popular providing hands-on learning experiences in woodland or natural environments. Learning through play outdoors, exploring the natural world as part of environmental education or being involved in work experience illustrate some of the wide variety of educational opportunities covered by outdoor learning at Loddon School.

The environment found beyond the sacred classroom is one well suited to a child who requires space to calm, a moderated sound input, natural light and a rich and

varied sensory experience. When a child is able to learn in situ the quality of learning can be more authentic and relevant. Sir Patrick Geddes, a town planner, biologist and educator stated that 'by living we learn'. This approach is highly relevant for children with SEND who find it hard to generalise learning. Trying to use skills learnt in a classroom in another location is a major difficulty experienced by children with SEND. The outdoors provides a variety of practical learning experiences which meet the needs of the child directly. The constant rhythms of the natural world provide consistency for children with chaotic lives. Outdoor areenspaces allow a child to feel 'wild', while also giving space to relax and time to escape the stresses and strains of daily life. To enable a child to engage with quality learning they need to be able to fully regulate themselves giving a sense of calm enabling their mind to be alert and ready

Chip and Don Heath (2007) describe the ingredients required for making learning stick, the SUCCES Formula. Their research explored why some learning memories stuck more than others. The ingredients are:

- Simple when outside a child can use natural objects which are familiar play items and being in situ the learning experience can be repeated easily giving the student confident to use and explore further.
- Unexpected child centred discovery learning outdoors establishes flow, engaging the child in the zone of learning.
- Concrete when learning is linked to real events practical skills are developed. Active or kinetic learning responds well to the needs of many children with autism or ADHD.
- Credible learning experiences play in a multisensory environment links well to the interests of the child and makes it engaging and memorable.
- Emotional when the inquisitive, enquiring mind makes a discovery the 'wow moment' happens and learning flow sticks firmly.
- Stories adventures in the outdoors art as a springboard to create a narrative, recalling the story many times making it a truly enriching learning moment.

Using the natural environment is highly beneficial for the well-being of staff and students. Humans need nature to thrive. Our cognitive, social, and emotional health is affected positively by time spent outside especially in natural space. Wendy Titman (1993) wrote about the positive effect that green spaces provide. They give

a sense of feeling wild, a place to think, provide calm and time out from the stresses and strains of modern living. Spending time outdoors develops attitudes and practices for students as responsible citizens and a lifelong appreciation of the natural world. The Loddon School models appropriate behaviours and attitudes for its students towards the natural world through active participation in horticultural learning, growing food in its large polytunnel; participating in the national Garden Bird Watch weekend; tending to a variety of animals on its small farm and working towards a number of awards in partnership with the Royal Horticultural Society and the Royal Society for Protection of Birds.

Learning through play is a well-established mechanism for teaching younger students. There does appear to be a paradox existing between this understanding and a fear that there is no time to play as we have so much to cover in our national curriculum. Outdoor learning is the ideal environment for the acquisition of mathematical concepts and the development of language, or the launch pad for creative writing. Active learning outdoors grounded in body movements and interaction with the natural environment create concrete experiences about number, weight, size, patterns and sequences. Structured exploration can lead to mathematical proficiency. Creating the inquisitive mind by looking through a mathematical lens at the world makes learning stick. Teaching about depth and measurement by stepping in puddles developing learning to volume displacement, filling containers or pouring when gardening shows mass measurement for solids and volume for liquids, riding a bicycle provides opportunity for understanding size when parking or riding through spaces, and speed and distance calculations. Mark making in a mud pit can allow a child to practice handwriting skills for twice as long through this type of 'play'. Story creation along a nature walk giving a landscape rich in material for the creative mind generates work of a standard far above that developed within the regular four walls of a classroom.

As a residential school we educate the child from their home base and use a variety of learning spaces. The Sensory Adventure Playground, Tranquillity Garden and Nature Trail emphasize exploration and discovery, sensory calm, and spiritual experience. The Trim Trail, Outdoor Gym, climbing frames, swings, roundabout and slide provide physical educational experiences. The Forest Schools area, Paddocks and smallholding, polytunnel and horticultural gardens allow students to gain work experience and environmental learning.

Introducing CReSTeD

Exploring the work of The Council for the Registration of Schools Teaching Dyslexic Pupils

CReSTeD

Introduction

The Council for the Registration of Schools Teaching Dyslexic pupils (CReSTeD) is a charity set up to help parents and those who advise them choose schools for children with Specific Learning Difficulties (SpLD) of which the main difficulty is dyslexia. There is however a general recognition that dyslexia rarely exists in isolation and latest research demonstrates a high level of co-occurrence with other difficulties. These include Dyspraxia, Dyscalculia, ADD, as well as Pragmatic and Semantic Language Difficulties.

CReSTeD acts as a source of information which can help parents making a placement decision about a child with SpLD. CReSTeD is a valuable resource for parents, educational advisers and schools.

CReSTeD was established in 1989 and publishes and maintains a list of schools and centres accredited for their SpLD provision - the Register - annually. The schools

and centres listed within the Register cover all levels of provision for SpLD pupils and include both state and independent provision. The vast majority of schools on the Register are mainstream, offering a wide range of teaching styles, environment and facilities.

The Register

CReSTeD's main activity is to produce and supply to parents, free of charge, a Register of schools and centres which provide for pupils with one or more SpLD. The levels of provision is divided into six broad categories, five for schools: Dyslexia Specialist Provision (Category DSP), Specialist Provision Schools (Category SPS), Dyslexia Unit (Category DU), Withdrawal System (Category WS) and Maintained Sector (Category MS) and one for centres: Teaching Centres (Category TC). Children have different requirements and personalities; the categories are a



way of helping match each child to the type of provision at the school or centre. A report from an Educational Psychologist or a specialist teacher who holds an Assessment Practising Certificate should offer guidance as to the level of provision relevant to the child.

A child at the severe end of the dyslexia spectrum may require a Dyslexia Specialist Provision school, whereas a child with, for example, only some slowness in spelling skills may be suitably provided for in a school from Category Withdrawal System. The categories offer this guidance. Note that the Maintained Sector is only open to local authority schools and not to Independent schools.

The Register is published annually and is obtainable from the CReSTeD Administrator or via the CReSTeD website: www.crested.org.ukThe website also includes links to all registered schools and centres as well as to other websites that may be of assistance to parents of children with one or more SpLD. There is also a checklist to help parents decide if a school or centre can meet their child's education needs in relation to SpLD https://crested.org.uk/documents/parentschecklist.pdf

CReSTeD Criteria and Visits

Every school and centre on the CReSTeD list has been independently verified for SpLD provision by CReSTeD consultants which is not the case in all other lists.

The first stage of any registration is for the school to complete the CReSTeD registration form and to provide supporting documentation, such as policies for dyslexia. This form covers staff development, admission policy, organisation of the school week, specific arrangements for SpLD pupils, examination results for the whole school and for SpLD pupils in particular, resources and a list of parents' names so that the Consultant may check parents' feelings about the school orcentre.

These criteria include the provision of relevant and high quality information technology resources, Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ) approved training qualifications for teachers, awareness of the needs of dyslexic pupils by the non-specialist staff, and arrangements to obtain and provide special provision for examinations.

Consultants, who look to see if this information is accurate and that the school or centre meets the criteria set by CReSTeD Council for the particular category, visit the schools.

Schools and centres are visited on a three yearly cycle, with possible earlier visits if there are substantial changes, which should always be swiftly communicated to CReSTeD. If the Head of a CReSTeD school changes, we require the school to inform us and ask the new Head to confirm that the school intends to continue with the SpLD provision in accordance with the criteria set by CReSTeD (at the agreed category level). This enables us

to retain the school's details in the Register without the need for an extra visit.

To encourage accuracy, Council require schools and centres to inform it of significant changes which impact on provision for SpLD pupils.

CReSTED Council will initiate 'responsive' visits if it has any cause for concern about a particular school.

The Register CReSTeD Council

Council includes representatives from a wide area of SpLD provision including Dyslexia Action, the British Dyslexia Association, Helen Arkell Dyslexia Charity, the Dyslexia-SpLD Trust and schools.

Categories

Categories are used to explain the type of provision given by a school. One category should not be seen as 'better' than another, but as a guide to the provision required by the student

There are six categories within our criteria according to the type of provision:

- **Dyslexia Specialist Provision (DSP)** schools established primarily to teach pupils with Dyslexia.
- Learning Support Centre (LSC) schools offer a designated unit that provides specialist tuition on a small group or individual basis, according toneed.
- Maintained Schools (MS) local authority schools able to demonstrate an effective system for identifying pupils with dyslexia. This category also includes the British Dyslexia Association's Dyslexia Friendly Quality MarkSchools.
- Specialist Provision (SPS) schools are specifically established to teach pupils with dyslexia and other related specific learning difficulties.
- Teaching Centre (TC) designated centre providing specialist tuition on a small group or individual basis, according toneed.
- Withdrawal System (WS) schools help dyslexic pupils by withdrawing them from appropriately selected lessons for specialist tuition.



Our vision is of a society where speech and language disabilities do not prevent a young person from achieving his or her learning and communication potential, building an independent life and contributing positively to society.

Moor House is a Non-Maintained Special School and College, a registered charity and a world class centre of excellence, consistently rated outstanding by Ofsted. It provides specialist education, therapy and residential care for children and young people with speech and language needs, increasingly referred to as Developmental Language Disorder (DLD).

We provide a nurturing environment where experienced teams care for the educational, emotional and developmental needs of each student, preparing them for a safe, happy and fulfilling life. Moor House provides integrated teaching, therapy and residential care services for students with DLD.

Each student is surrounded by a multi-disciplinary team, supporting their learning and emotional well-being with intensive speech and language therapy, specialist literacy intervention, occupational therapy, physiotherapy and psychotherapy. Students receive one-to-one and small group teaching and bespoke therapy, and have access to a range of activities to develop new skills and build friendships.

This enables students to reach their highest educational and communication potential, and also to develop much higher levels of independent living skills, self-expression, and self-esteem.

Learning

Students are taught in small groups by teachers with experience working with children with language difficulties. Adapted language and specialist teaching strategies are used so that students can understand and develop the language that they need for learning.

Speech and language therapists (SLTs) work closely with teachers to support each child's difficulties and strengths. Teachers plan and deliver lessons collaboratively with SLTs to help students develop curriculum language.

Curriculum and Progress (School)

An adapted National Curriculum is taught and tailored to the students' strengths while helping them with areas of difficulty, and there is a particular emphasis on English, literacy, life skills and social skills.

We deliver exceptional outcomes for DLD children, helping our students to make outstanding academic progress, narrowing the gap significantly between themselves and their mainstream peers. Students take qualifications that match with their skills and level of development. We offer GCSEs in English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Science, ICT, History, Fine Art and Ceramics. We also offer Functional Skills qualifications in English and Maths, vocational qualifications such as Home Cooking Skills at Levels 1 and 2, the AQA Unit Award

Scheme in Science, and Entry Level qualifications in subjects such as English, Maths. ICT. DT and Music.

College (Sixth Form) Curriculum

Our objective is to support students to gain vocational qualifications, make confident and appropriate life choices and to be prepared for the next stage of their adult life. Specialist staff support students to access local partner college courses in Art and Design, Child Care, Media Studies, Floristry, Construction, Catering, Sport, Performing Arts and Animal Management, from Foundation and Level 1 in Year 12 to Level 4 at the end of Year 14.

We provide specialist support to achieve additional qualifications in Maths and English and develop important skills for life and employment, through individual study programmes and after college support.

Speech and Language Therapy

SLTs work throughout the day with students, individually, in groups, as well as in the classroom where lessons such as English are jointly planned and delivered.

Each therapist has a small caseload of children and gets to know their abilities and personalities. The intensive therapy programme may focus on learning skills,



developing strategies to communicate, and support the student to understand their own strengths and difficulties. We teach skills for talking in everyday situations, language for lessons, social skills, friendship skills and independence.

We have developed specialist evidence based methods such as Electropalatography (EPG), Shape Coding by Susan Ebbels® and signing with grammatical markers.

Occupational Therapy

Occupational Therapists (OTs) work on life skills to help students develop their independence in areas such as handwriting, touch typing, doing up a tie or shoe laces, travel or cooking skills. Strategies are provided to develop sensory processing in lessons to manage and improve attention control.

We have a dedicated Team of OTs and a fully equipped OT suite which includes sensory integration equipment. The therapists communicate regularly with parents about their child's progress.

Residential Care

Our residential community provides single room facilities within our beautiful Village; three newly built student houses, located around a communal square for relaxing after school.

The students frequently describe their house as a 'home from home' and their wellbeing is assured by their key workers, who look after students' emotional welfare and provide a range of therapeutic strategies after school in a happy, stimulating and caring environment.

Our Residential Care continues to be rated "Outstanding" by Ofsted who noted: 'Children and young people thrive in this residential setting ... (they) blossom in their confidence and self-esteem. Those who have had very poor school experiences and, in some cases, have refused school, look forward to their return to the provision after the weekend. Children and young people who stay in the residential setting feel safe and secure. There is an excellent approach to supporting children and young people towards independence'.





The School designation of Social, Emotional and Mental Health only goes a short way to describing the complexity of our students. We offer a broad curriculum as well as 'Heart' our Therapeutic Centre, Steam Lab (in conjunction with Lego Education) and our Forest School. We have up to 150 places, 29 of which are Residential, and our setting is based on a 32-acre site in the Heart of Sevenoaks, Kent.

Who we support

Students referred to us will have seen their mainstream provision break down, some having worked their way through several specialist providers unable to meet need or effectively engage with the young person. Others may have come from the Health sector, having been resident in a mental health provision. The SEN diagnosis of our student group is varied, many





Founded in 1939, More House School is an independent day and boarding school with more than 480 boys on roll, making it the largest specialist school of its type in the country. Many boys travel long distances to attend the school, which is currently used for placements by 30 local authorities.



Teaching is tailored to pupils' individual needs by specialist teachers and a broad and imaginative curriculum inspires creative and enthusiastic learners. Indoor and outdoor zones provide a vibrant learning environment, and there are sensory and soft play rooms for sensory integration. Primary pupils enjoy regular learning and social opportunities at neighbouring schools and take part in an extensive programme of enrichment activities.

Secondary

There is a high level of personalisation in the curriculum for secondary pupils and a range of subjects can be studied at different levels, from entry level to GCSEs and their equivalent. The development of literacy and numeracy is a key priority, and this is achieved through intensive specialist teaching in small classes. As well as traditional academic subjects, our curriculum provides a strong focus on creative and practical subjects that develop social communication and other essential skills for future adult life.

Sixth form

The sixth form offers our students the opportunity to study a wide range of academic and vocational courses linked to two local colleges. Students have full time support from learning mentors who are all trained to support the communication needs and learning of our students. Linking with mainstream colleges helps students build wider friendship groups and offers new social opportunities.

The sixth form residential setting provides a full life-skills programme which is accessible for young people with a





range of additional needs such as visual impairments. By the end of their time at St John's, students have well-developed independence skills for adult life.

Curriculum

The curriculum is organised with a focus on personal development and outdoor learning is a key aspect of our pupils' learning experiences. Our careers programme is designed to expand young people's knowledge of the world and raise their aspirations. These young people are

supported by expert staff, and learning concentrates on presenting meaningful experiences that avoid sensory overload. Communication systems are built around the child's preferences, including PECs (Picture Exchange Communication system), Makaton, hand over hand signing and computer aided systems.

Boarding facilities

The residential areas are homely and welcoming. Young people who board live in small family units and are looked after

by an experienced and knowledgeable staff team, who help them to form positive relationships and develop negotiation and co-operation skills. There is a full programme of leisure activities, and children have the opportunity to participate in local clubs and sports societies. The school offers weekly or flexiboarding, and all students go home every weekend. In 2019 our residential care was rated as 'Outstanding' by Ofsted.

Home school links

Very close links with families are maintained, with updates on progress and achievements through frequent emails and phone calls home. Parents are always welcome to visit the school, and are kept up to date with activities by the half termly newsletter.

General environment

The school is within walking distance of the elegant and vibrant Georgian village of Boston Spa, where there are shops, cafés and parks. The extensive buildings are well-equipped and include a gym with specialist fitness equipment, a purpose built theatre and sound recording room, a fully stocked library, an IT suite and a number of sensory rooms. The grounds are perfect for sports and leisure activities, with marked pitches, a hard surface multi-sport area and a newly-developed sensory garden.




