Types of provisions available:

- Mainstream colleges: large further education providers delivering courses varying from BTEC Level 1 to A Levels
- <u>Specialist colleges and sixth forms:</u> specialist education providers that are small in size and specialise in a specific area of need. For example: Highshore School (Mixed Needs) and Spa School (Autism). The Park College (19-25) and Orchard Hill (19-25) **EHCP required**
- <u>Supported Internships:</u> Structured study based work programme for young people aged 16-24 with **EHCP**. Combination of study and work. For example: Care Trade
- Apprenticeships: usually a 12 month programme combining work and college.
 Requirements include 5 GCSEs in Math and English (C or 4)
- <u>Traineeships:</u> Pre apprenticeship for those who do not meet the requirement of an apprenticeship. This can last from 6 weeks to up to 6 months. Focus on functional skills

What are LDD Courses?


LDD Courses are highly supported and specifically designed educational provisions in a college for learners with learning difficulties and disabilities.

All courses are designed to meet the requirements of the Foundation Learning Framework and include an emphasis on personal and social development, progression, life and money and employability skills were relevant to the student.

Many LDD Courses offer vocational pathways including; Beauty, Construction, Catering and Retail.

What is a Supported Internship?

- Structured study programme based primarily at an employer
- For young people aged 16-24 with an EHC Plan to achieve employment
- Learn the skills needed for work, through learning in the workplace
- Unpaid, and duration of programme can vary and last upto 12 months
- Young people will complete a personalised study programme which includes the opportunity to study relevant qualification. If appropriate, and English and Maths




