THINGS TO DO FOR YOUR LITTLE ONES AND BIG ONES

We have put together a few ideas of places that are available for you to do with your little ones or for your bigger ones to attend. They are set up with deaf children and teenagers in mind and give them an opportunity to mix with deaf peers.

Our Under Fives group continues to grow. Parents can bring their little ones along to have fun, sing songs and catch up with other parents. We have a great space to use at 1st Place, Chumleigh Gardens (12 Chumleigh Street, SE5 ORN). The sessions are once a month on a Monday from 10:30am until 12:00pm. They are run by Emma and she is joined by a fellow Teacher of the Deaf (ToD) each week. We also welcome a specialists Speech and Language therapist to some sessions so that you are able to ask any questions you may have.

We would love to see lots of you there. If you would like any more information, please do speak to your ToD.

For those of you with older ones David Pogson, ToD at Elm Green Secondary school, has started an after school club, called Sonic Youth. It runs once a week to provide an opportunity for tweens and teens (years 5 - 13) to get together. The group is held at the school every Thursday during term time from 4 - 5:30pm. They play games, chat and generally get to hang out with their peers. Again, if you would like more information please contact your ToD.

With the holidays coming up you may be thinking of ways to keep your children and young people entertained. There is a small Deaf led charity which was set up in 2010 to support the Deaf Community around London. It is called Remark! They provide courses, support, clubs and holiday playschemes. The playschemes run every school holiday and are for Deaf children between 6 and 16 years. The activities they offer are both indoor and outdoor. Previous ones have included sports, baking and crafts activities as well as day visits to adventure parks, trampolining or wall-climbing. You can follow the link below to find out more information.
